S4TL (*Seminar For Tomorrow's Leaders*) is a week-long leadership training program for high school students. This is a joint youth Leadership Project of our District along with District's 6890 and 6960. Students attending S4TL are challenged to utilize all available skill, knowledge, talent, expertise, and intelligence towards completing specific goals and objectives.

The ultimate objective/goal of S4TL is for each student to leave the with a new awareness of themselves and be more finely tuned to utilize their God-given abilities to serve others in leadership capacities throughout life.

This award-winning program has a reputation of transforming the lives of these young leaders. It is composed of first year Rotary sponsored delegates, second year delegates called Junior Staff Leaders, and third year delegates called Non-Rotarian Senior Staff. DELEGATES are the high

school students Rotary Clubs send to the Seminar. Only those delegates selected for Junior Staff may return for a second year. Our club has been a proud sponsor of this program for many years. Each year we select delegates who return with glowing reports on how their life was changed as a result of the information they heard. This year was no exception. The delegate selected by Tony and Bob to represent our club was Santoy Campbell. He came back excited and eager to share what he had learned. Per his report, the thing that he valued the most occurred when he realized that he could just be himself that it's O.K. to admit when you do not know something, and that he does not have to try to compare himself to others in order to get accepted. The time spent was enjoyable and pleasant. I think that he was having so much fun that he did not realize that he was learning life changing, lessons that would make him a better person.

The student's day runs from approximately 7am-11pm, during which time they are exposed to nationally known speakers, coaches and volunteer Rotarians. They are taught Rotarian values from the get-go. They are taught how to make good decisions

and that they not only are responsible for their decisions, but how important it is to give back to their community.

The Seminar Director and the Rotarian staff choose JUNIOR STAFF LEADERS from the previous year's delegates. Selections are made based on having demonstrated outstanding leadership skills warranting an invitation to participate for a second year. Our club was fortunate again, in that one of the students we sent on last year, Matthew McKinnon was invited back to participate as a Junior staff leader. He too had a blast, and is now getting ready to start college in the fall. The program is a great learning experience for all involved, including Rotarians.

One unique feature of S4TL is the "rap sessions" where the leaders of tomorrow are divided into groups of 16-18. They meet with Rotarians to discuss topics of interest to them. No holds are barred, and both the Rotarians and the students learn from each other. Participation in the rap sessions is a privilege and shows us how bright the future is with such intelligent and responsible students who are in training to become our leaders or tomorrow.
