The goal of each of these meetings is to insure that every member has a clear understanding of what's going on in the club, and what is happening in our monthly board meetings. David also shared with Sarasota Keys Rotary members his goals and objectives for the coming year.

Top priority is the growth of our club. Incumbent upon everyone is the responsibility to share Rotary. With that in mind, we will have our first Rotary awareness venture in November. Our club will have a

booth at the Sarasota Reading Festival that will take place outside of the Selby Library. This festival draws a large crowd each year. We will have the opportunity to pass out literature on Rotary and expose our club to thousands of new potential members. Plan now to be a part of this effort.

The second major emphasis will be on maintaining open lines of communication between the board and the club. Each meeting following the monthly board meeting will be dedicated to giving an overview to the club of all of the decisions that were made in the board meeting.

The foundation board on last week approved three grant requests. The first was to continue support of the Food Basket program that we do in conjunction with the Salvation Army. This grant submitted by Vince Little was unanimously approved. It will provide grocery two times a year to needy families identified by the Salvation Army.

The second grant request was for the dictionary project. This

will enable our club to supply dictionaries to Wilkinson Elementary, Westcoast School For Human Development, Neighborhood Learning Center, Wakeland, Samoset, Manatee, Anna Maria Elementary and Tel Mond, Israel. The total number of dictionaries supplied will come to 910.

The final grant was presented by Sandy Kehoe. This will assist with the production of an exercise DVD for seniors.

The board also approved a dues increase of fifty dollars per quarter to begin on the next billing cycle. This was initially approved in December of last year but had not been enacted.

All hands on deck as we go into high gear to make our Annual Fund Raiser "The Iron Chef" a big success. Each member is expected to sell at least two tickets and to assist with gathering auction items. Please see Jewel Elmsweller or Sally White for more info.

Your board is at work to make this a great club, and to continue all of the great things that we are known for.
